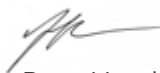
There is some really great reading in this issue and we hope that you can take some time to grab a cuppa and have a read.

## The Milford Foundation Scholarship Programme

We are excited to share with our readers that the Foundation board has approved funding for the development of a Milford Foundation Scholarship programme that we intend to launch later this year into selected high schools throughout the country.

### Purpose/Aim:

The Milford Foundation scholarship aims to reduce inequality in access to tertiary education, by providing financial support to school leavers for whom cost is a barrier. Scholarship recipients will also benefit from the Milford Foundation network to support them in their higher education journey and career path.

### Background:

The Milford Foundation scholarship will start supporting its first cohort of recipients in the 2023 tertiary year. The Milford Foundation has been born out of a desire to make a significant positive impact for our communities, and to help build a stronger New Zealand.
