I had one of those moments recently when I attended the Ūawa Tolaga Bay pump track opening. The track was built with financial assistance from the Foundation, following our Burgers, Beers and Brilliant Sportspeople event last year. I was honoured to join the ceremony, with the community coming together for a joyous celebration on a bright, early-winter morning. Seeing children race around the track, with proud whānau watching, was a reminder of why the Foundation does what it does.

Ūawa Tolaga Bay had been heavily hit during Cyclone Gabrielle, and the aftermath left the community feeling disconnected, without a centralised outdoor location for tamariki and rangatahi to gather. The pump track is so much more than just a trail. It's a place where children can spend

time together exercising and connecting. We've heard that the track is in heavy demand before school - it's a great motivator to get out of bed!

The Ūawa Tolaga Bay community are enjoying their town's newest recreation area - the Ūawa Skate 'n' Park Pump Track, which officially opened at the end of May.

Following Cyclone Gabrielle in early 2023, the area was isolated from the rest of the region, and beaches and playgrounds were destroyed.

The new pump track has already proved massively popular, and given a boost to the community. It also connects Ūawa Tolaga Bay to a global pump track network through Velo Solutions, which built the track.

The Milford Foundation is proud to have supported this community, and help them find some joy again after a very difficult year.
